INTEND TO AMEND THE ACTION PLAN FOR NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM 1 (NSP1)

The Puerto Rico Department of Housing (The Department) intends to amend its Action Plan for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program 1 (NSP1) to notify the public facility activity to be add with the Program Income funds. All other sections of the plan remain unchanged.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

According to Federal Regulation, 73 Federal Register 64322, notification to the public is required regarding changes to amend the Action Plan. HUD is providing alternative requirements to 42 U.S.C. 5304(a)(2) and waiving 24 CFR 91.105(c)(2), 91.105(k), 91.115(c)(2), and 91.115(i) to the extent necessary to provide no fewer than 15 calendar days for citizen comment. The Department will post the final amendment on its official website along with a summary of citizen comments received within the 15-day comment period.
